About Sisters Academy of Baltimore

Sisters Academy of Baltimore, a middle school for girls, grades 5 – 8, opened in September 2004. Co-sponsored by the School Sisters of Notre Dame, the Sisters of Bon Secours USA, the Sisters of Mercy and the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, the academy seeks to offer an independent school experience for girls who otherwise would not have access to a faith-based, private education. Sisters Academy’s model centers around a holistic education, small classes, extended school day, summer sessions, parental involvement/family atmosphere, and continued support throughout high school, college, and beyond. Sisters Academy is small by design: enrollment is capped at 80 students. Our student-teacher ratio will not exceed 10:1 and is currently 7:1. All students are funded through private scholarships and not through tuition.

Sisters Academy is fully accredited by the Association of Independent Maryland and DC Schools and is a member in good standing of the NativityMiguel Coalition of Schools.
